CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Kevin White called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and confirmed a quorum of the council was present.

DISCUSSION ON ACTION ITEMS, PUBLIC HEARINGS, PRESENTATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. Discuss and consider action on a proposed tax rate for FY 2020-2021.

Councilmember Greg Hollen made the motion to propose a tax rate of 0.532, the no-new-revenue tax rate. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Sue Jones. Those voting Aye: Sue Jones, Greg Hollen, Mitchell Tuck, Jayne Lankford and Polly Jones. Absent and not voting: Cassandra Sampson. None voting Nay.

2. Discuss and consider action on a budget amendment for the Police Department to purchase three new patrol cars.

Chief Charles Bittner addressed the council. These new cars will be a police package but will not be outfitted at this time. The dealership had a very low price on current year models. The police department does not have enough vehicles to allow officers to have a take-home vehicle. This is a problem when recruiting qualified officers as most law enforcement departments around us can offer this added benefit. Take-home cars would primarily be for supervisors. Mrs. Karch informed the council that this budget amendment will change the proposed FY 20-21 budget because it is dipping into funds that were going to be reserves. Councilmember Jayne Lankford made the motion to adopt the budget amendment ordinance in the amount of \$95,000. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Polly Jones and carried by a unanimous roll-call vote.
